STRANGERS OR SIBLINGS?

Which would you rather be, a stranger or a sibling - an outsider or part of the family? Our celebration of the Eucharist is not meant to be a "assembly of strangers" but rather a 'family gathering'.

Have you ever considered these words as we pray them during mass? "...and to you my brothers and sisters..."

Many of the Prayers that we say at mass are communal prayers. Twice during the Confit-eor we call on our "brothers and sisters". We respond to the Prayer of the Faithful with "Lord, graciously hear US". Just before the Holy Communion we call on the Lamb of God to have mercy on US. In fact the great prayer that Jesus himself taught us is a communal prayer. When Jesus was asked by His disciples to teach them to pray he didn't teach the "my father" but rather the "OUR Father". The Lord's prayer can be called the 3, 5, 1 prayer. Three times we use the 'our', 5 times we use the word 'us' and once we use the word 'we'.

Mass begins as we gather, as we leave our homes to gather, as we approach the door of the church; when we gather we become what we are the body of Christ, and we make Christ present in and through each other—our sisters and brothers. That is one of the reasons that we greet each other with the sign of peace, to be reconciled with each other but also to acknowledge that we are family and are here together.

The Eucharist is a communal prayer; we pray for each other, we pray for the needs of the Church - parochial, diocesan and universal. We pray for and with each other; we offer praise and thanks to God together.

Let's take a moment to look around and to greet our sisters and brothers sitting close to us, let us make a conscious decision to pray for them remembering that we are all God's family.
