

#### **CHRISTIAN LITERATURE**

It is at the heart of the moral conscience that the eclipse of the sense of God and of man, with all its various and deadly consequences for life, is taking place. It is a question, above all, of the individual conscience, as it stands before God in its

today subjected, also as a result of the penetrating influence of the media, to an extremely serious and mortal danger: that of confusion between good and evil, precisely in relation to the fundamental right to life.

### **THE FEAST OF ST LAURENCE 0'TOOLE (1128 – 1180)**

The 14th of November is the Feast of St Laurence O'Toole. Also known as Lorcán Ua Tuathail, he was born at

Castledermot, Kildare, Ireland. He was elected archbishop of Dublin in 1161 – he was the first elected archbishop, since his predecessor, Gregory, had already been bishop of Dublin when the city was raised to an archbishopric. He was the first Irish bishop of Dublin, and also the last one before the Reformation: Ireland was invaded by the Normans in 1170 and his successors were all Normans or Englishmen. He took part in the negotiations consequent on the invasion, and negotiated with Henry II of England. Forbidden for a while to return to Ireland after being made a papal legate by the

Pope in Rome, he eventually persuaded Henry II to let him return, but he died on the journey, at Eu in Normandy.
